Church Safeguarding Training: Thursday, July 13

Shepherding people in our congregations is a high calling especially being attentive to the threat and actions of sexual abuse. Protecting the vulnerable, caring for victims and implementing measures is mission critical. Our association has committed to make this issue a centralized focus for Strengthening Churches.

On April 11, Attorney Curtis Bostic & Pastor Marshall Blalock helped equip 13 church teams in safeguarding the church and serving those who have been abused. Their qualified voices and expertise pointed leaders toward protocols and resources.

As a follow up to this introductory consult, on **Thursday July 13**, Attorney Bostic will join us for a workshop offering legal counsel, practical protocols and tools to equip leaders.

Additionally, our state and national convention are actively creating and curating resources for best practices and next steps. State Convention leadership has prioritized and funded a full-time staff position for a qualified individual who is trauma-informed and biblically equipped to help church leaders and congregations. Immediately following the SBC convention in June, a church-based tool kit as well as a national database listing those who have been credibly accused will be launched. STRENGTHENING LEADERS

Replenish Week Reflections



We know that the complexity of needs, fatigue of decision-making and spiritual warfare stretches out margins of time, emotions and energy. Because of these dynamics, ministry is demanding and often depleting for pastors, spouses and staff. In March, the Charleston Baptist Association conducted replenishing gatherings to strengthen leaders and churches both personally and professionally. Pastor Mark Hallock of Calvary Baptist Church in Denver, Colorado served as our speaker and consultant within three relational environments.

We hosted an evening of encouragement to invest time and care in the marriages of CBA pastors and spouses in addition to a workshop on

church renewal. We learned from Pastor Hallock about church renewal in principle and in practice as he is a catalytic leader who is navigating a city-wide church renewal movement in Denver. Every church needs to experience renewal whether the vision for the church is in decline or when a church is asking what's next. There is always a path forward and there are windows of opportunities to seize. As the demographics of Greater Charleston shift every year and cultural complexities take new turns every 6 months, every church needs to revisit context, recast vision and renew values.

We concluded our Replenish Week with a staff development day at Peaceful Way's Retreat Center in Ravenel (pictured above). Mark brought a timely message about experiencing joy in life and ministry and being a relentless encourager. We rejoice over the pastors, spouses and staff members who participated!

Don't Pastor Alone

Charleston Baptist Association is intentionally focusing on connecting relationships and fostering leader health among those who lead the church. Thirty-eight percent of pastors and 43% of staff have considered leaving the ministry based on *Barna Research* (2021). One of the marks of success that we have targeted as an association is in strengthening leaders. Therefore we seek to create environments and opportunities to serve and assist leaders in their personal and professional pursuit of living and leading well.
